THE 48TH HIGHLANDERS OF CANADA

The Society was founded in 1836 by prominent citizens of Scottish descent to help immigrant Scots as they arrived and settled in their new country. From earliest times the Society performed charitable work in the city and celebrated St. Andrew's Day on November 30th with a dinner accompanied by traditional music and toasts. Later in the century the St. Andrew's Ball was officially inaugurated and became the fashionable formal event we know today.

The Society continues its charitable work by providing grants to numerous agencies helping people "in transition" in the city of Toronto through membership donations and the proceeds of the St Andrew's Charity Ball. The Society also holds regular meetings and supports cultural events on Scottish themes.

The 48th Highlanders of Canada is Toronto's only Highland Regiment. Soldiers of the Regiment have served Canada with distinction overseas in South Africa, World War I, World War II, Korea, and on many United and NATO missions including the Middle East, Cyprus, Bosnia, Kosovo, Sierra Leone and Afghanistan, earning 50 Battle Honours for outstanding service to Canada. Highlanders have also served on domestic operations including the 1997 flood relief in Manitoba, the 1998 Winter Ice Storm in Ontario and Quebec, the 2010 G8/G20 summit, sovereignty operations in Northern Canada, refugee support in 2016 and flood relief in eastern Ontario in 2017.

Raised in 1891, the Regiment celebrated its 125th Anniversary of service to Canadians in 2016. Since the founding of the Regiment, the histories of both the 48th Highlanders of Canada and the St Andrew's Society of Toronto have been interwoven and are characterized by over 125 years of mutual support.
